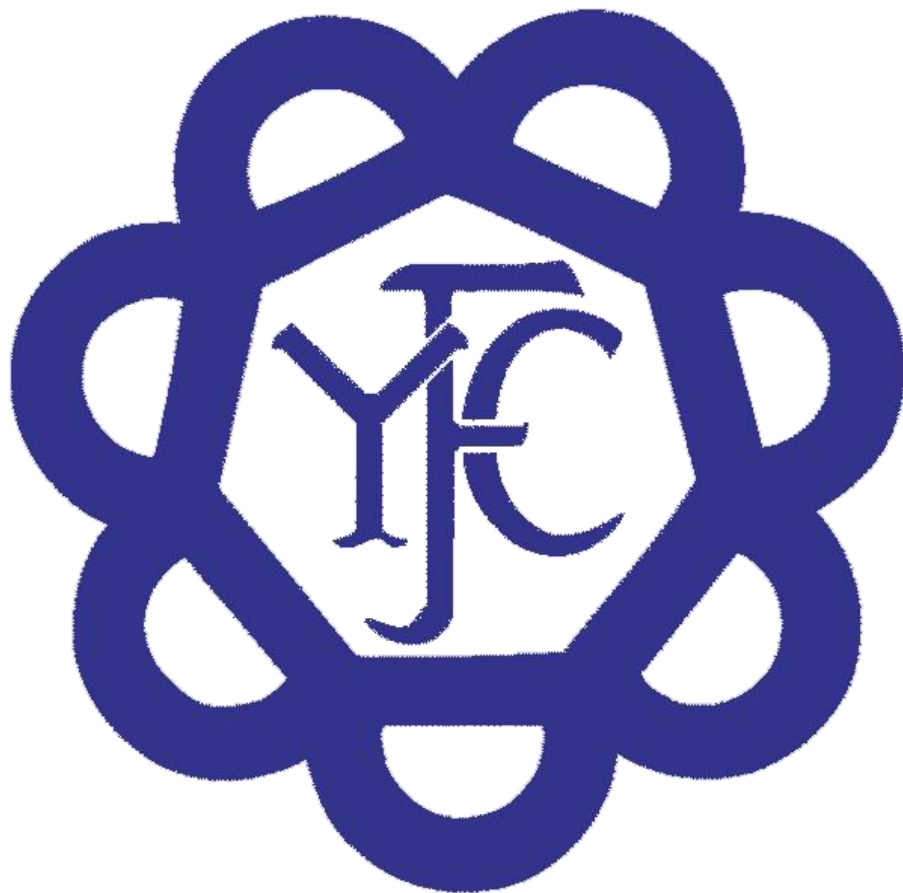


**Berkshire FYFC
Virtual Rally

Summer 2020**



County “Virtual” Rally Classes Rules 2020

1. Competitors must be paid up members of Berkshire Federation of YFC and must not represent more than one club in the ‘show’.
2. Competitor eligibility is defined as per National membership guidelines for 2019 – 2020; Junior; members aged 16 years and under on 1st September 2019. Intermediate; members aged 21 years and under on 1st September 2019. Senior: members aged 26 years and under on 1st September 2019.
3. Open Classes are open to all members. Members may only compete “up” one membership section e.g Juniors may compete in the Intermediate section but not the Senior section.
4. Entries are unlimited for Clubs. Members are limited to one entry per class.
5. All entries should be submitted directly to the office berksyfc@btopenworld.com in electronic format as a photo or photos (where requested show evidence of own work), where applicable scanned/ pdf files will be requested.
NOTE: The County will use the images of members creating their entries to promote YFC activities and illustrate member activities and talents.
If you do NOT want your image used in this manner, please indicate with your entry.
6. The top three entries from each Club will gain points that go towards their club totals. All individual entries will gain points that go towards the competitors individual totals.
7. Scoring; the County rules apply – available on request.
8. Entries must be the competitors own work - unless family/ sibling assistance indicated in Class description.
9. Exhibits should be this years’ work - NO exhibit can have been displayed at a previous show/ rally and all must be unaided work of the competitor. Exhibits can only be entered in one class; they may NOT be entered for multiple classes.
10. All entries must be submitted via to the County Office with clear indication of.
 - A. the Competitors name
 - B. Club and Membership number where applicable.
 - C. the correct class number.**NOTE:** this information will not be available to the judges who will be drawn from the whole Berks YFC community.
11. Scores will count towards the relevant Country Fayre silverware.
12. Closing date for entries is **Monday 31st August 2020**. Entries may be submitted at any point up to this date.

Junior Classes 2020

Class	Type	Description
1	Floral Art/ Flower Arranging	<p>Make and display a flower arrangement (in a vase or jug) suitable as thank you gift.</p> <p>To be viewed from the front. May include accessories. Unlimited size.</p> <p>Materials should be taken from your garden (or neighbours or close family relative) NOT shop bought. It is NOT necessary to use oasis.</p>
2	Cookery	<p>Make and display a garden picnic suitable to feed your family, to include at least three separate items.</p> <p>Entry should be submitted with your menu and a picture of you making the picnic and your family enjoying the food.</p>
3	Baking	<p>Make, decorate and display six cupcakes suitable as a thank you to an NHS Keyworker.</p> <p>Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor decorating the cupcakes.</p>
4	Needlework	<p>Competitor to make a fabric facemask.</p> <p>Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor creating the mask.</p>
5	Photography	<p>Competitor to take and display a single picture entitled "British Countryside". Should be accompanied with a supporting image of you in front of the scene pictured.</p>
6	Art	<p>Create an animal drawing based on instructions from Rob Biddolph (see <i>Youtube</i>). A4 paper. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor and artwork part-way through.</p> <p>Finished pic can be submitted as image or as pdf.</p>
7	Creative Writing	<p>Write a short report on your experiences of home-schooling during the Covid-19 restrictions.</p>
8	Woodwork/ Metalwork	<p>Create a useful item by repurposing or recycling wood or metal from around your home. No size limit.</p>
9	Horticulture	<p>Exhibit your work in the garden during Covid-19 restrictions, this may include a big project you have helped with, your own part of the garden or simply growing sunflowers/ pumpkins etc. Submit pictures and any supporting documentation that shows your involvement and the development of the area/ plants.</p>

Intermediate Classes 2020

Class	Type	Description
10	Floral Art/ Flower Arranging	Make and display a flower arrangement (in a vase or jug) suitable as token of gratitude to an NHS frontline worker. To be viewed from the front. May include accessories. Unlimited size. Materials should be taken from your garden (or neighbours or close family relative) NOT shop bought. It is NOT necessary to use oasis.
11	Cookery	Make and display a main course meal, using local produce where available. Entry should be submitted with description of the dish and a picture of the meals' preparation.
12	Baking	Make, decorate, and display a simply sponge cake (of your choice) suitable as a thank you to a Key worker. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor baking and the recipe used.
13	Needlework	Competitor to make a fabric facemask. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor creating the mask.
14	Photography	Competitor to take and display a single picture entitled "at work in the British Countryside". Should be accompanied with a supporting image of you in front of the scene pictured.
15	Art	Create a piece of artwork in any medium that represents "lockdown". Any size. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor and artwork part-way through. Finished pic can be submitted as image or as pdf.
16	Creative Writing	Write a report describing the Coronavirus pandemic and Covid-19 restrictions that would be suitable for inclusion in a 2020-time capsule.
17	Woodwork/ Metalwork	Create a useful item by repurposing or recycling wood or metal from around your home. No size limit.
18	Horticulture	Exhibit your work in the garden during Covid-19 restrictions, this may include a big project you have helped with, your own part of the garden or simply growing sunflowers/ pumpkins etc. Submit pictures that show your involvement and the development of the area/ plants.

Senior Classes 2020

Class	Type	Description
19	Floral Art/ Flower Arranging	Make and display a flower arrangement (in a vase or jug) suitable as token of gratitude to a Key Worker. To be viewed from the front. May include accessories. Unlimited size. Materials should be taken from your garden (or neighbours or close family relative) NOT shop bought. It is NOT necessary to use oasis.
20	Cookery	Make and display a main course meal, using local produce where available. Entry should be submitted with description of the dish and a picture of the meals' preparation.
21	Baking	Make, decorate and display a birthday cake suitable as a thank you to a Key worker. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor baking and the recipe used.
22	Needlework	Competitor to make a fabric facemask. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor creating the mask.
23	Photography	Competitor to take and display a single picture entitled "at work in the British Countryside". Should be accompanied with a supporting image of you in front of the scene pictured.
24	Art	Create a piece of artwork in any medium that represents "lockdown". Any size. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor and artwork part-way through. Finished piece can be submitted as image or as pdf.
25	Creative Writing	Write a report describing the Coronavirus pandemic and Covid-19 restrictions that would be suitable for inclusion in a 2020-time capsule.
26	Woodwork/ Metalwork	Create a useful item by repurposing or recycling wood or metal from around your home. No size limit.
27	Horticulture	Exhibit your work in the garden during Covid-19 restrictions, this may include a big project you have helped with, your own part of the garden or simply growing sunflowers/ pumpkins/ window boxes etc. Submit pictures that show your involvement and the development of the area and or plants.

Open Classes 2020

Class	Type	Description
28	Entertainment	YFC's Got Talent. What is your party trick - send in your videos and clips – we know that you've all got Talent, let's see it! May include siblings/ family members, or even pets!
29	Club Video Entertainment	Club to submit a “lockdown video”. Submit a video of Club Members involved in any of the various lockdown viral trends – Toilet Roll Challenge, Dairy challenge etc etc. Should feature a minimum of six members.
30	Art Design	Design the front cover for the 2020/ 2021 Berkshire Young Farmers Yearbook. The design should reference all five Berkshire Clubs. Size A5. Can be hand drawn or computer designed but must be suitable for printing and publicity. <i>Winning entry to be used for the 2020/ 2021 County Yearbook.</i>
31	Needlework	Design and create a Flag to celebrate and acknowledge Keyworkers in general or specific group of Keyworkers. Any size. Should be accompanied with a picture of competitor creating the flag.
32	Club Floats	Create a model “Club Float” in any medium or materials available (cardboard, Lego, Meccano, whatever you choose) that represents a Club Float in the co-operative competition. Theme for Floats is the “ National Health Service ”
33	Publicity/ Club meetings	Create your ideal YFC Programme. Show us what you'd like to see your club doing meeting wise when your club is allowed to meet again (following the <u>complete</u> lifting of Covid-19 restrictions). Programme should cover a minimum of SIX Club meetings.

Under Club Age Classes 2020

5 years and Under

Class	Type	Description
34	Painting	Competitor to do a hand-print painting featuring the colours of the rainbow.
35	Art	Make a thank you card for a Key Worker – could be for your teacher. Any size or medium.
36	Craft	Competitor to paint or decorate an 'elephant' made from recycling a plastic milk container (<i>see Google or YouTube if unsure</i>). <i>Parent/ guardian to cut the container!</i>
37	Baking	Competitor to decorate and display six biscuits (biscuits can be bought). Decoration should be as colourful and sweet as possible.

Under Club Age Classes 2020

6 to 9 years

Class	Type	Description
37	Painting/ colouring	Competitor to create a painting or drawing incorporating a rainbow.
38	Art/ Craft	Collage or mosaic depicting a key worker in uniform. Any size, any materials.
39	Craft	Competitor to paint and/ or decorate one or more 'elephant' made from recycling a plastic milk container (<i>see Google or You Tube if unsure</i>). <i>Parent/ guardian to cut the container please!</i>
40	Baking	Competitor to make, decorate and display six matching cup-cakes. Any decoration (no bought cake toppers).

Over Club Age Classes 2020

Class	Type	Description
41	Flower Arranging (Petite)	Make and display a petite flower arrangement in a teacup. Maximum size, 15cm x 15cm x 15cm To be viewed from the front. May include accessories. Materials should be taken from your garden (or neighbours or close family relative) NOT shop bought. NOT necessary to use oasis.
42	Cooking	Competitor to produce their “best BBQ meal”. Entry should include a brief menu, image of food cooking and a plated meal.
43	Baking	Competitor to make, decorate and display twelve cup-cakes suitable for a YFC Fundraising ‘cake-sale’. Any decoration (no bought cake toppers).
44	Painting/ colouring	Competitor to create a painting or drawing any size or medium. Subject to be “a reflection of lockdown”.
45	Photography	Competitor to submit two images entitled “On my walk I saw...”
46	Soft craft	Competitor to make and display any item of soft craft – needlework, quilting, knitting, crochet, lacework etc.
47	Woodwork/ Metalwork	Create a useful item by repurposing, recycling or even refurbishing wood or metal from around your home.
